





"Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to destroy them?" we asked.



"Hooray for Piper," Pierce shouted. "I'm glad you taught us the Mad Glad Game!"


"Hip hip hooray!" all the penguins shouted.

Piper felt so glad that things had worked out. He raced through the swirling snow and joined the penguins huddling close together. By working together and caring for each other, they'd keep warm all winter.









