



Paul's Testimony - Acts 26

Paul provided a great biblical example of sharing your testimony in Acts 26. Called to court in Caesarea, he was told to state his case before Roman officials, prominent citizens, and even a king! Let's look at how Paul shared his testimony with those there.

Acts 26:9-10

"I myself was convinced that I ought to do many things in opposing the name of Jesus of Nazareth. And I did so in Jerusalem. I not only locked up many of the saints in prison after receiving authority from the chief priests, but when they were put to death I cast my vote against them."

Acts 26:12-14

"In this connection I journeyed to Damascus with the authority and commission of the chief priests. At midday, O king, I saw on the way a light from heaven, brighter than the sun, that shone around me... I heard a voice saying to me in the Hebrew language, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?'"

Acts 26:15-16

And I said, 'Who are you, Lord?' And the Lord said, 'I am Jesus whom you are persecuting. But rise and stand upon your feet, for I have appeared to you for this purpose, to appoint you as a servant and witness to the things in which you have seen me...'"

Acts 26:19-20

"I was not disobedient to the heavenly vision, but declared first to those in Damascus, then in Jerusalem and throughout all the region of Judea, and also to the Gentiles, that they should repent and turn to God, performing deeds in keeping with their repentance."
