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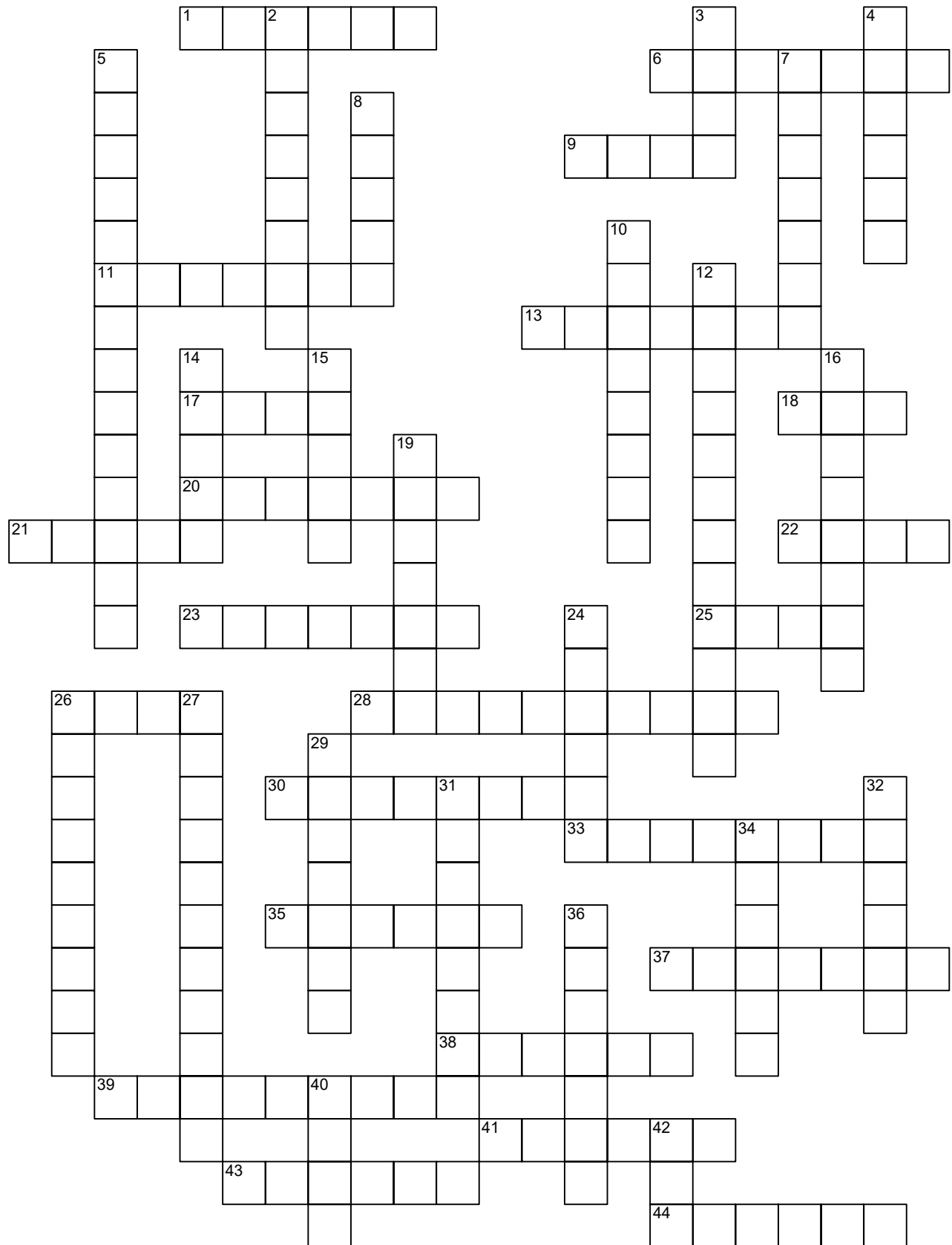
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Galatians 5 Crossword Puzzle

All verses without mention of a Bible book or chapter are taken from Galatians 5. The translation used is the English Standard Version (ESV).



ACROSS

- 1 Our faith and hope of righteousness come through this Being in verse 5.
- 6 In verse 26, Paul warned the Galatians not to have this attitude.
- 9 Paul used the word *walk* in the context of verse 16 to describe this action verb.
- 11 To obtain, acquire or receive (verse 21)
- 13 Paul instructed believers in Galatians and Romans 13:14 to not do this with fleshly desires.
- 17 This fruit of the Spirit mentioned in verse 22 means seeking what is a sacrificial choice to act in another's best interest.
- 18 John 8:36 says that if this individual "sets you free, you will be free indeed."
- 20 The Greek word for the work of the flesh in verse 20 is *pharmakeia*, or *pharmacy* in English. In this pagan religious practice, mind-altering substances were used in an attempt to communicate with false deities.
- 21 Believers are saved by grace and this, not works.
- 22 To desire something that belongs to someone else
- 23 What synonym for liberty (*eleutheria* in Greek) did Paul use in verses 1 and 13?
- 25 Those who are "led by the Spirit" (verse 18) have a special relationship with God. What are we called in Romans 8:14?
- 26 What word describes our relationship to sin now, according to Galatians and Romans 6:11?
- 28 Paul used this term in verse 8 to describe an influence toward salvation by works.
- 30 This fruit of the Spirit in verse 22 enables believers to endure hardship.
- 33 Someone you should love in the same way you love yourself
- 35 According to Colossians 3:16, how are we to let the word of Christ dwell in us?
- 37 Freedom in Christ expressed by actions that benefit others (alluded to in verse 13).
- 38 A synonym for bitter dislike or hatred (verse 20)
- 39 Counted as righteous (verse 4).
- 41 Paul used this verb in Romans 8:11 to describe the presence of the Holy Spirit in the believer (also referred to in Galatians).
- 43 Paul said he had been crucified with this person.
- 44 What word did Paul use in Acts 20:29 to describe the false teachers he warned against in Galatians 5?

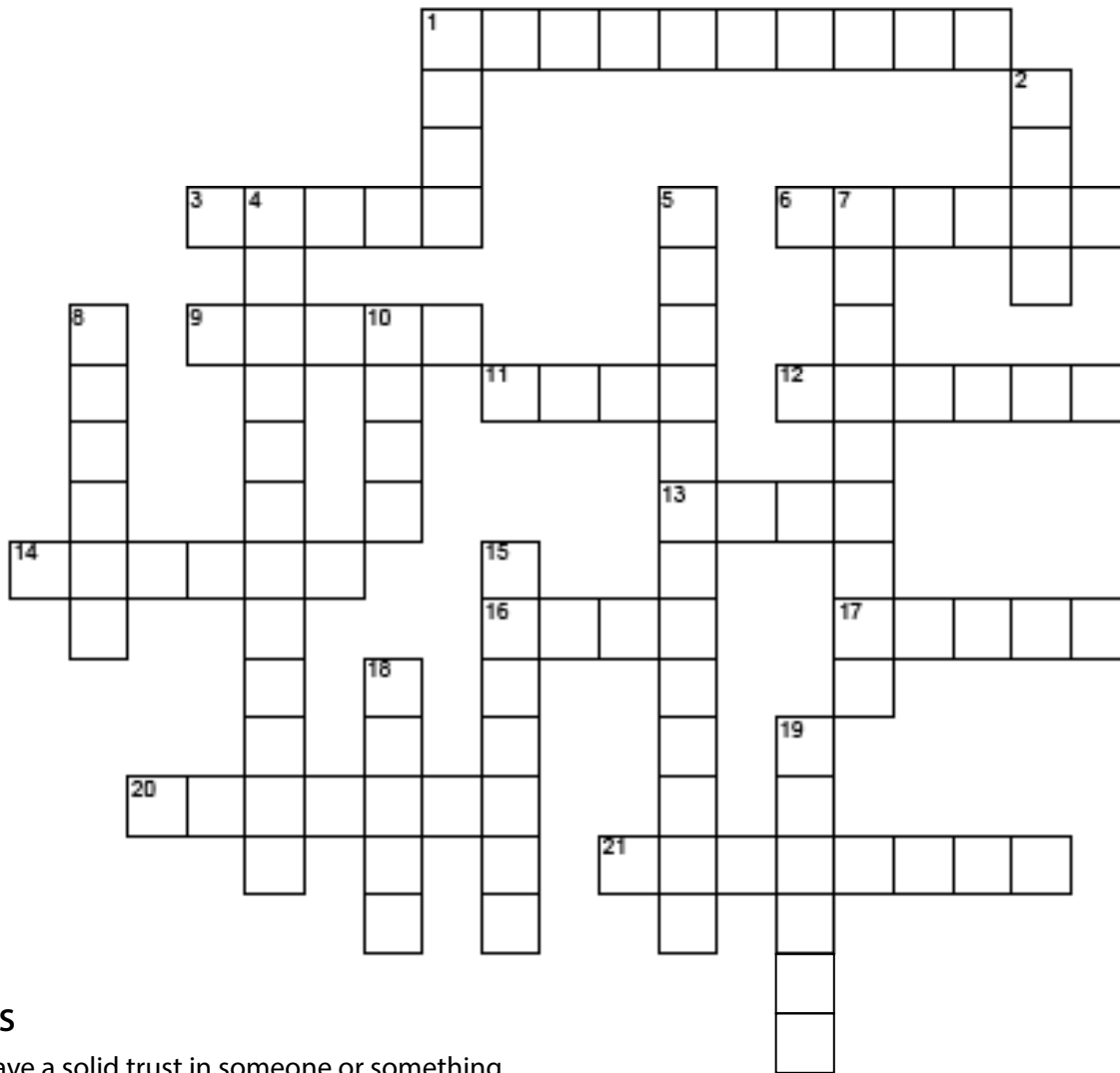
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- 2 Worship of anyone or anything other than God
- 3 A device placed on oxen and other animals to control them.
- 4 Paul used this verb to describe the indwelling of the Holy Spirit in Ephesians 5:18.
- 5 Romans 6:22 says that freedom in Christ leads to this.
- 7 To nail or tie a person to a cross, or to overcome something through putting an end to its power. Paul said his fleshly desires were nailed together with Christ on the Cross.
- 8 Walking in the Spirit produces this (verse 22).
- 10 Desiring what someone else has or fearing that your possession will be taken away (verse 20)
- 12 Some Jewish Christians insisted that Gentile Christians observe this command in Mosaic law as a condition of salvation (verse 3).
- 14 Referred to in verse 17, this word in Greek is *sarx*, which can mean the physical body, as well as human nature with its frailties, weaknesses and imperfections.
- 15 This fruit of the Spirit in verse 22 "surpasses all understanding" according to Philippians 4:7.
- 16 God's people are free. According to Ephesians 3:11-12, what do we now have in Christ?
- 19 To incite feelings of anger or resentment (verse 26)
- 24 An ingredient used in baking to lighten or ferment dough. The apostle Paul used this term to describe how bad ideas can easily spread throughout the church.
- 26 Paul used this word in Galatians and Romans 16:17 to describe disagreements that separate people within a group.
- 27 Paul listed this work of the flesh in verse 21 as well as in Romans 13:13.
- 29 Paul said in Romans 7:6 that since Christians are released from the law, this word no longer describes us.
- 31 Paul used this word in Romans 6:6 to describe a person who is subject to the desires of the flesh.
- 32 What synonym for proclaim (*kerusso* in Greek) did Paul use in verse 11?
- 34 Those who belong to Christ are not under the Law (verse 18), so God will write His law here instead of on stone tablets (Jeremiah 31:33).
- 36 Freedom in Christ means you've been empowered to deny the wrong kind of these aspects of the flesh (verse 16).
- 40 How did Paul entreat the Galatians to stand and not give into legalism (verse 1)?
- 42 Those led by the Spirit are not under this.

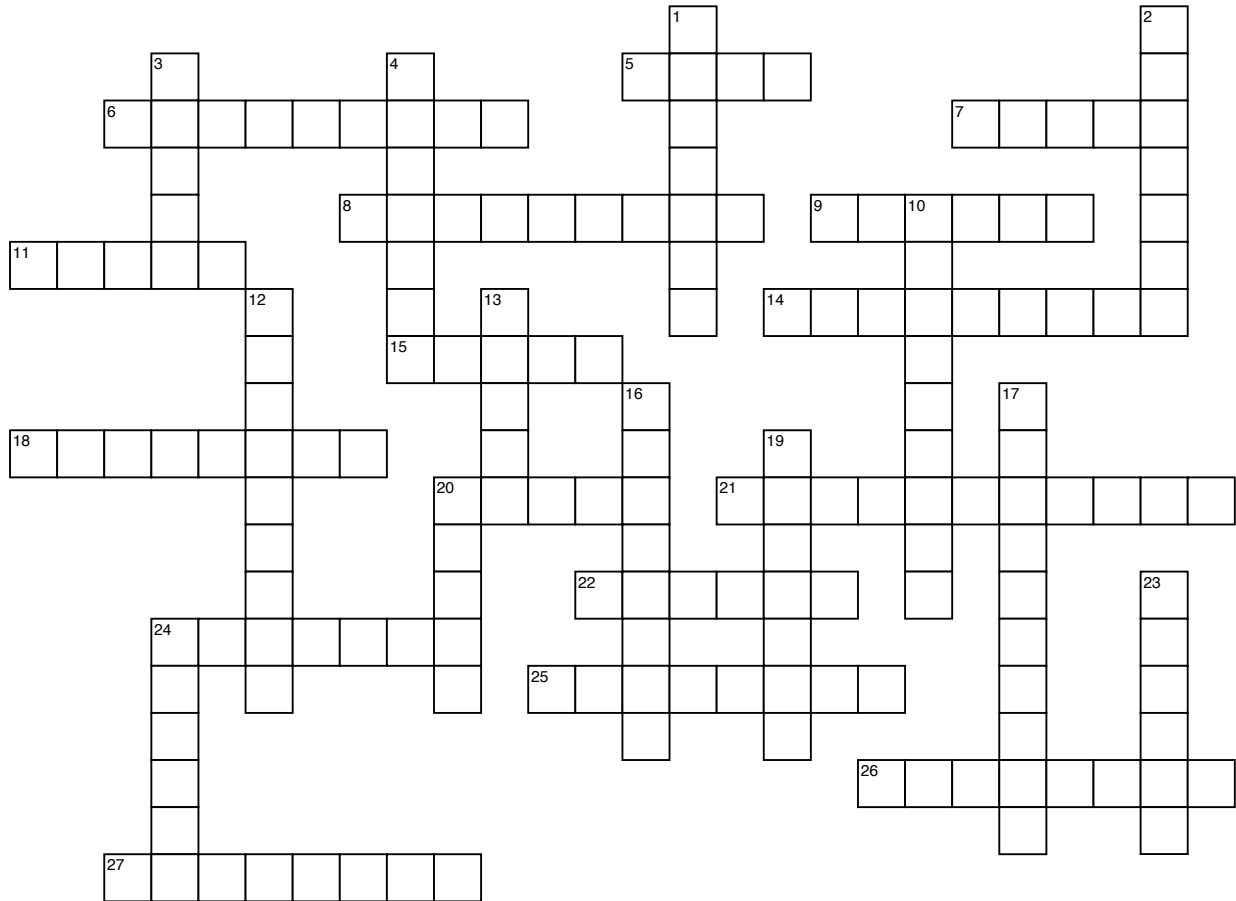

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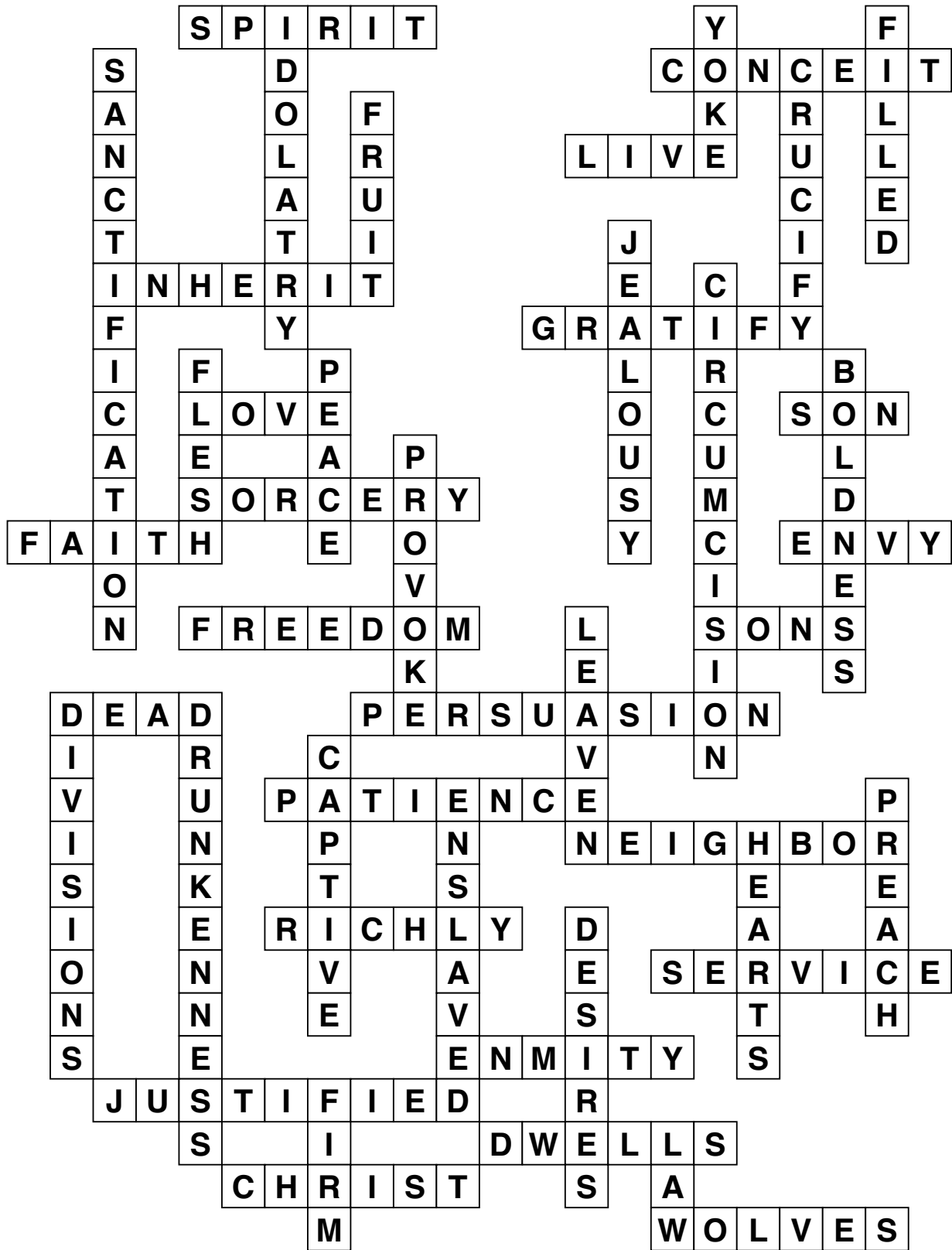
