- 3 What's the nicest way to challenge your friends?

- 1 What does it mean to "look at the world through Jesus-colored glasses"?

- 2 Why is it easy to follow the beliefs and patterns of the world? How can a Christian worldview protect you from dangerous teachings?
- 3 Who is your spiritual mentor? If you don't have one, list three people who could help you grow closer to God.
