

Pretty Puffy Pouch

Crochet a small granny square style keychain to hold your earbuds, lip balm or extra cash!



GATHER: 100% cotton size 3 yarn, 3.125mm crochet hook, slender, large-eyed needle, scissors and 1.9 inch kiss clasp

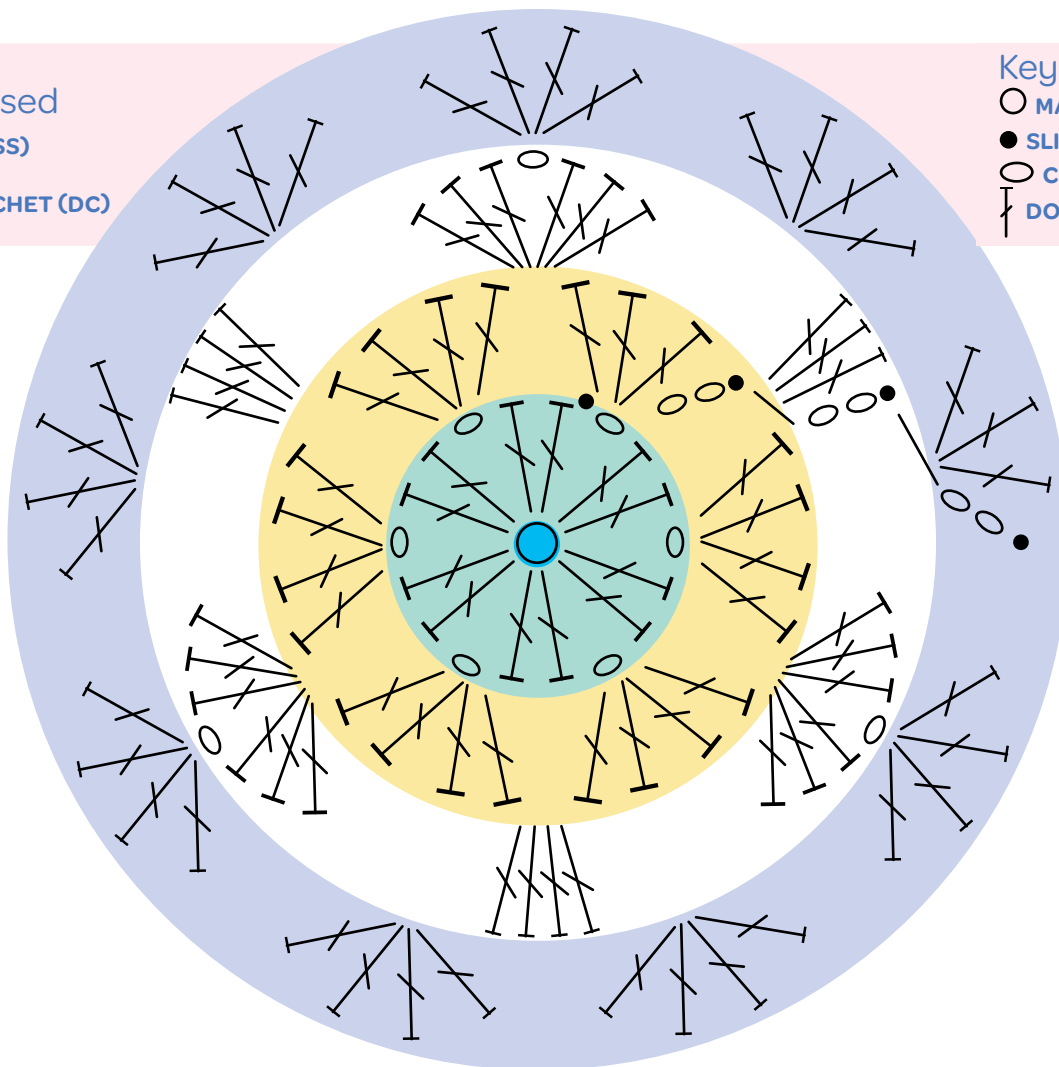


Stitches used

SLIP STITCH (SS)
CHAIN (CH)
DOUBLE CROCHET (DC)

Key

Round 1

Start with a magic ring.

In ring, make *2dc, ch1; repeat from * five more times. To join, ss into first dc. (6 chain-spaces)

Round 2

Ch2; make 3dc in that chain-space.

*Make 4dc in the next chain-space; repeat from * four more times. To join, ss into first dc.

(6 chain-spaces)

Round 3

Ch2; make 3dc in that chain-space.

*Make 3dc, ch1, 3dc in the next chain-space. Make 4dc in the following chain-space; repeat from * one more time.

In the last chain-space, make 3dc, ch1, 3dc. To join, ss into first dc.

(9 chain-spaces)

Round 4

Ch2; make 3dc in that chain-space.

*Make 4dc in the next chain-space; repeat from * seven more times. To join, ss into first dc.

(9 chain-spaces)

Finishing

Knot off the final tail, leaving at least 18 inches.

Secure any remaining knots if you used multiple colors.



If you're a crocheter beginner, it's best to use a single color of yarn. If you choose multiple colors, switch colors at the beginning of a new row and secure with a knot.

Assembly



1. Turn your pouch so knots are on the inside and insert it loosely into the kiss clasp, positioning the tail at the hinge opposite the keychain.

2. Thread a wide-eyed needle with the tail.

3. Tuck the edge of the pouch as securely as possible into the clasp gap.

4. Starting from inside the pouch, insert the needle through the fabric and into the first hole of the clasp.

5. Continue pressing the pouch edge into the gap while sewing a running stitch—passing the needle through the next clasp hole and back into the pouch.

6. Repeat this process around the entire clasp until you reach the final hole. Then knot off the thread to secure it.



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
