

Easter Flex

Looking for a way to share the Good News of Easter? Just fold up a flexangle! Also known as a kaleidocycle, this craft brings together math, paper and art to make a fun 3D model. Use the pictures to help you remember what happened when Jesus died and rose again.

Go to ClubhouseMagazine.com to download and print this flexangle, along with helpful Scriptures you can share.

Gather

- scissors
- clear tape

Go

1. Cut out the pattern or go to ClubhouseMagazine.com to download a PDF pattern. Thicker paper works better.
2. Fold dotted lines toward you. Unfold.
3. Fold solid lines away from you. Unfold.
4. Keep the pictures facing out and roll the flexangle longways into a tube.
5. Roll small pieces of tape to make them double-sided and stick them on the triangles with the word "tape."
6. Stick the diamonds with the points to the tape.
7. Wrap the flexangle short ways into a circle shape. Use tape to stick the end tabs inside the opening at the other end of the flexangle to form a closed loop.
8. Gently push inward to rotate the pictures and share the Easter story with someone who needs to hear about Jesus' sacrifice! 🏠
